### Update from USDA regarding Efforts to Address Food and Agriculture Sector PPE Challenges

Obtaining personal protective equipment, face coverings, cleaning and sanitation supplies for essential workers and businesses has been an ongoing challenge across multiple segments of the food and agriculture sector.

The California Department of Food and Agriculture is reminding us to review this FEMA Fact Sheet: [Coronavirus \(COVID-19\) Pandemic: Addressing PPE Needs in Non-Healthcare](#)

**Setting**, which summarizes how organizations should consider and manage their personal protective equipment (PPE) needs while ensuring the protection of workers during the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic response.

CDFA has communicated with the National Emergency Management Association, and they have affirmed the process laid out in this document for critical infrastructure PPE and cloth face covering needs as described below:

**For PPE and Cloth Face Covering needs:** if suppliers are unable to provide for your needs, and the PPE is urgently required, submit a request for assistance to [your state emergency management agency](#).

If the state is unable to address needs, the state should submit a request for support to their FEMA Regional Response Coordination Center.

CDFA emphasizes that maintaining the health and safety of employees in addition to ensuring continued operations and a plentiful food supply during this unprecedented time is paramount. Our Nation's food and agriculture workers play an integral role in the continuity of our food supply chain.
