What is Agricultural Recycling?

- Up-Cycling a Co-Product or By-Product for a more productive use then is currently occurring in the marketplace
- Agricultural Recycling can be broken down into these categories:
 - Agricultural Co/By-Products
 - Food Diversion
 - Food Co/By-Products
 - Industrial Co/By-Products
 - Other Co/By-Products

California Agricultural Co/By-Products

- Yearly estimated volume = 12,400,000 tons
- Grain & Rice Milling
- Nut Crops & Co/By-Products
- Cottonseed Co/By-Products
- Sunflower Co/By-products
- Safflower Co/By-products



California Food Diversion

- Yearly estimated volume = 7,400,000 tons
- Dried Bakery & Cereal goods
- Cull Fruits & Pits
- Cull Vegetables



California Food Co/Byproducts

- Yearly estimated volume = 3,200,000 tons
- Wine & Juice Co/By-Products
- Brewery Co/By-Products
- Olive Co/By-Products
- Tomato Processing Co/By-Products
- Sugar Processing/Production
- Milk & Cheese Co/By-Products



California Industrial Co/By-Products

- Yearly estimated volume = 4,500,000 tons
- Ethanol Production & Co/By-Products
- Fat & Vegetable Oil Production Co/By-Products



How Does Agricultural Recycling Work?

- Where would these Co/By-Products go without us?
 - Compost
 - Landfill
 - Spread out in Fields & Hillsides
- Where do these Co/By-Products go as a result of us?
 - Poultry, Pork, Beef & Dairy Feed
 - Bedding, Road Base, Fireplace Logs, Fertilizer
 - Abrasives, Makeup, Alcohol, etc..

Why Does Ag Recycling Work in California?

- California is uniquely qualified to maximize the benefits
 - CA produces a wide variety of Co/By-Products
 - CA has the animal population to consume the Co/By-Products
 - CA has the infrastructure in place to move these products
 - Processing facilities have been built to handle the goods
 - Businesses have developed around the industry
- Agriculture operates on thin margins
 - Incentive to maximize every aspect of the Good, for the Good

Benefits of Agricultural Recycling

- Processors
 - More profitable
 - Lower costs for consumers
- Better use of the product
 - Feed that is recycled does not have to be grown
 - Lower carbon footprint/ESG
 - Reduces landfill waste
- Supports CA Jobs & Industry





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

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

Almond Hull & Shell: 542,579


Corn By-products: 869,184

2022 New CA Regulations for By-Products




Section 2804 defines specific by-products which are eligible.

Human Food By-product Diversion Tonnage: 887,845 Tons October 1, 2021- September 30, 2022

Eligible for reduced tonnage tax of \$0 for the first 1,000 tons and then \$0.05/ton.

Any firm <u>solely</u> diverting eligible products without further manufacturing is eligible for reduced license fee of \$100.



Tonnage Tax Reporting in ExtraView



Voluntary Reporting of By-products (Organic Waste)

- No tonnage reported in this section October 1, 2021-September 20, 2022.
- Guidance available in ExtraView.
- Voluntarily report tonnage which is <u>NOT subject to</u> <u>any tonnage tax</u> but is otherwise diverted to animal feed.
