To Tackle Problems that Impact Our Industry.

In-Use Locomotive Regulation

The California Grain and Feed Association (CGFA) worked cooperatively with the California Air Resources Board (CARB) staff and Board members on their proposed "In-use Locomotive Regulation." The goal of the proposed "In-use Locomotive Regulation" is to reduce criteria pollutants, toxic air contaminants, and greenhouse gas emissions for locomotives. The proposed regulation will include line haul and switcher locomotives. In the Fall of 2022, the CGFA invited CARB's internal leads to tour two grain and feed operations. The opportunity educated CARB staff on the unique way CGFA members receive and offload grain into their facilities. CARB staff asked several questions on the specific locomotive engines, the process for grain and feed operatorations, and logistical questions on each facility. In furtherance of the tour, CARB staff welcomed the opportunity to meet with CGFA members via Zoom to participate in a discussion of the proposed regulation. As a result, several members from CGFA participated, voiced their concerns, and offered to provide CARB with recommendations on the proposed regulation.



Educating Municipalities on Organic Waste

California regulations to encourage recycling of organic matter has created new opportunities and competition for the feed industry. Working with a firm called Diversion Strategies, CGFA worked to educate waste management operations in cities around the state about the continued need and demand for organic waste by the feed industry to ensure these markets are maintained, and enhanced, for our members.




